With wife Kathi by his side. **Dennis Blake West, 78,** of Williams Bay, WI, died at home on January 28, 2022.

Dennis said he was "born, old and grumpy, in Rockford, IL in 1943." A 1961 graduate of Rockford West High School, Dennis attended the University of Illinois in Urbana for two years, then "stumbled" through a number of jobs before landing one at WROK radio. He spent most of the next 25 years selling advertising, managing others who did the same, and finally becoming president and general manager of WIFR-TV

and a Vice President of Worrell Broadcasting. During his 21 years at WIFR, he won several awards for editorial writing for such organizations as United Press International, the Associated Press and the Illinois Broadcasters Association. He also worked at the CBS Television Network, leaving television in 1988.

A year after he and wife, Kathi, moved to their summer home in Williams Bay, he entered the University of Wisconsin, Madison, where he completed the journalism degree begun in 1961. In about 1993, the family moved to the Lake Geneva area. After editing *The Bay Times* and running his own advertising agency, in 1996, he purchased and, for over 25 years, edited the monthly newspaper, *The Beacon*, now a bi-weekly publication with a circulation of 20,000 in greater Walworth County, WI (including the resort communities of Lake Geneva and Delavan.) Part of that publication is a section called Good Humour, using the British spelling that kept the GH ice cream company from suing him. In addition to WestWords, he authored "Bringlish: A Reader's and Viewer's Guide to British English."

Dennis was a friendly, outgoing person, always ready to share a good story, and never shy about giving his opinion. His regular Beacon column, WestWords, was an entertaining mix of information, humor, and words of wisdom. He will be missed by many. He and Kathi enjoyed many travels and good times together. He and about a dozen high school classmates, called themselves The Old Warriors, gathered each summer in northern Wisconsin to relax and reminisce. He loved his pets, especially

his cats. He once said that when he died, he hoped he'd go to a place where all his former pets would be. Here's hoping he's with Charlie, Noah, and many more.

He is survived by his loving wife of 57 years Kathi Bovi West; sons Paul and Mark West; grandsons Miles and Ethan West; sister Martha West; brother Paul West; and cats Molly and Shamus.
